



Continuing Professional Development for Dental Professionals

1. Continuing Professional Development (CPD) is a continuous learning process that complements formal undergraduate and postgraduate education and training to maintain and further develop competence and performance. CPD enables you to maintain and improve across all areas of your practice (see <https://www.gdc-uk.org>). It is the responsibility of individual dental professionals to ensure that they undertake a range of CPD activities that reflect the needs of their practice and their own learning needs.
2. The following are courses and events administered by the Resuscitation Council (UK):
 - Advanced Life Support (ALS) course
 - European Paediatric Advanced Support (EPALS) course
 - Immediate Life Support (ILS) course
 - Paediatric Immediate Life Support (PILS) course
3. CPD credits can be obtained for both attending and successfully completing the assessment process. Courses are scored based on 1 credit per hour of educational content and are capped at 7 credits per day (excluding coffee breaks, lunches, etc), or 15 credits for 2-day courses. Individuals may only claim the number of hours that they attend.
